Haiti's massive earthquake has been the world's most devastating natural disaster since World War II. This disaster of biblical proportions have left 230,000 people dead, more than 300,000 wounded, 1.5 million homeless, 250,000 homes destroyed, 30,000 businesses lost, and more than 800,000 people have returned to the country side from Port-au-Prince, according to the Haitian Prime Minister.

With the massive relief effort from around the world, many survivors have received some assistance. Sending monetary donations directly, along with medical supplies, and prayers have been extremely important and continue to be. Meanwhile, our organization (ayitigouvenans.org) has been working directly with local leaders in quake devastated areas to create and implement projects that will help Haitian people sustain themselves long term.

Help Haitians Sustain Themselves at Home

With the upcoming growing season and the destruction of the seed banks, the need for seeds and farm tools are critical. In addition to the devastation in Port-au-Prince, nearby **Carrefour** (epicenter of the quake) and **Léogane** Counties have been hit the hardest. More than 80 percent of these counties comprise fertile farmlands; and crops grown there help sustain a large number of families and individuals living in both urban and rural areas.

In less than three months, with seeds you donate, Haitians will be able to harvest crops to sustain themselves in their homeland. This will also promote short and long-term empowering change.

As the saying goes: ***"Give a man a fish; you have fed him for a day. Teach a man to fish; and you have fed him for a long time."***
